The Trinity

There is no mention of the word Trinity in the Bible. My sole purpose for using this word is to reference Merriam-Webster's dictionary definition of the unity of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit as three persons in one.

A concept that may be challenging to comprehend alone. However, its clarification is essential for anyone who wants to preserve their faith in Jesus Christ.

Without this ultimate act of love, we would be condemned to the loss of our souls and excluded from eternal life (1 Peter 2:24) because of our sinful nature. It is the blood of Christ that delivers us.

The Holy Spirit. The manifestation of God's power, reign, and glory is through the Holy Spirit. Shared with us, the Holy Spirit is God's spirit. He shares our life, and all that is of God is revealed through Him. Our lives are inhabited by the Holy Spirit, who is God.

To live our relationship with God to its fullest, we must practice our faith in God, the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Jesus, the Son, performs all miracles because of the grace of God the Father and is ultimately manifested by the Holy Spirit.

Explaining the Trinity in its entirety would be challenging or nearly impossible. It's like someone asking us to explain what love is. We know its existence, but it is only known after we have experienced it.

The same approach applies to the Trinity, which is part of the mysteries of God. Only after we have come to know it through the privilege of our faith can we experience it.

Hopefully, the truth will reveal itself to you, and these writings will bring you a meaning that will strengthen your faith.

This prayer is to be recited for accepting the New Covenant in Jesus Christ.

Almighty Father,

I acknowledge that I am a sinner. I believe in Jesus Christ, your only Son, who died and rose again for my sins. In him, I profess my faith and ask your forgiveness. Thank You for Your Love, Your Faithfulness, and the New Covenant in Jesus Christ. Amen.
